Wilmington International Airport (ILM) offers non-stop flights from Atlanta, Charlotte, Dallas, Fort Lauderdale, New Haven, New York, Newark, Orlando, Philadelphia, Tampa and Washington D.C., as well as seasonal direct flights from Baltimore, Boston, Chicago, Minneapolis/St. Paul and Miami. Wilmington and its island beaches offer many ways to keep kids of all ages excited, engaged and entertained. From adventures aboard river boats and steering a WWII battleship to giant slides at a water park, a trip packed full of family fun awaits kids and adults alike.

CHILDREN'S MUSEUM OF WILMINGTON

The museum immerses children in art and science to cooking and conservation in fun ways. Enjoy magical and playful experiences for pre-school to elementary age, and their adult company.

· WILMINGTON RAILROAD MUSEUM

Explore more than 20 model trains, a life-size caboose and a 100-year-old steam locomotive as you learn how the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad served the city from its inception. Kids can build their own train tracks in the play area.

CAPE FEAR MUSEUM OF HISTORY AND SCIENCE

Become an astronaut in Space Place or get a selfie with a model of a 20-foot-tall ground sloth. Do all this and more as you explore more than 57,000 items at the state's oldest museum that is dedicated to the region's rich history and culture.

· BATTLESHIP NORTH CAROLINA

The world's greatest sea weapon when commissioned in 1941, the ship saw action in every major Pacific battle during WWII. Take a self-guided tour of nine levels of living spaces, mess decks and more. Reserve a spot on the Second Deck tour to learn about life aboard ship.

· NORTH CAROLINA AQUARIUM AT FORT FISHER

With more than 2,500 animal residents, the NC Aquarium is a ready-made adventure. See alligators, sting rays, sharks, otters, sea turtles and more. Reserve tickets in advance online and add on a behind-the-scenes tour.

JUNGLE RAPIDS FAMILY FUN PARK

Splash your way through a fun day at this water park and lazy river for the whole family. Or, race Go-Karts, climb a rock wall, try your hand at miniature golf and play laser tag.

· WATER TOURS AND CRUISES

Whether you enjoy a scenic sunset cruise aboard Cape Fear River Boats' Henrietta, book the eco- and historyfocused Eagles Island Cruise from Wilmington Water Tours or just take the Bizzy Bee water taxi to Battleship NORTH CAROLINA, kids and adults alike enjoy getting out on the water. Charter a custom Epic Excursions sunset cruise out of Wrightsville Beach or set sail on Soundside Adventure's Island Hopper Cruise to explore Money Island, Masonboro Island Reserve and more. Charter an Epic Excursions sunset cruise or enjoy a custom seaside charcuterie spread on a private island. Book a Downtown Tasting Tour to sample Wilmington's everexpanding culinary community. And the beach - don't forget the beach!

BREWERY & DISTILLERY TOURS

Experience Wilmington's historic sites by E-Bike with stops at Wilmington breweries, or book spots on a pedal pub to sip, pedal and cruise your way on a fun-filled adventure. Sign up for a Haunted Pub Crawl or take the self-guided Wilmington Ale Trail. If cocktails are more your style, kick back and sip on small-batch vodka, gin and rum cocktails at awardwinning distillery lounges and tasting rooms, some offering tours.

GOLF

Tee off at several area golf courses. The Wilmington Municipal Golf Course was named one of the best courses by Top 100 Golf Courses of the World. The lush greens at Beau Rivage Golf & Resort offer enchanting water views and an 18-hole course that will put your skills to the test. Tom Fazio created a stunning 18-hole, par 72 course at Porters Neck Country Club. You can also challenge your friends to rounds of digital golf, rain or shine, or a rousing game of disc golf at an island brewery.

FISHING & WATERSPORTS

Charter a deep-sea fishing tour from one of several charter companies or cast a line from Johnnie Mercers Fishing Pier or the Kure Beach Fishing Pier. Find more prime fishing spots at Carolina Beach State Park. You can also submerge and explore dozens of shipwrecks and offshore ledges with guided charters, or book surf or SUP lessons from local pros and hit the waves.

SHOPPING

Stroll the River District for welcoming shops lining main streets and pop into The Cotton Exchange or Chandler's Wharf Warehouse



Shops to explore the many specialty boutiques inside. Browse Market and Front Streets and the racks at Edge of Urge, Aqua Fedora and more for handmade and independent designer clothing and accessories or find vintage wares at the shops along Castle Street.

For one-of-a-kind gifts, designer clothing and wine afterwards, visit the charming open-air shopping village Lumina Station or head to the beaches for surf shops and resort-wear apparel boutiques. Don't forget the 90+ eclectic shops and restaurants at Mayfaire Town Center, Wilmington's premier lifestyle shopping center.

MUSEUMS, THEATER & MUSIC


Wilmington's museums invite all ages, but some events are geared especially toward adults. The Latimer House Museum's special Nighttime Tour lets you experience nightlife and gas light in a Victorian home. The Burgwin-Wright House also offers a nighttime tour on the first Friday of the month. Stroll the grounds of the Bellamy Mansion Museum during the day. Enlist friends for a visit to Cameron Art Museum where you can view the exhibits and grab lunch on the CAM Café patio. Delve into the region's history at the Cape Fear Museum of History and Science.

One of the oldest and most beautiful theaters in the country, Thalian Hall Center for Performing Arts, hosts 500 performances per year. The Wilson Center stages Broadway shows, comedy shows and concerts. And two outdoor waterside amphitheaters present national and regional acts to enjoy beneath the stars. For your pre- or après-experience, meet for a cocktail at a rooftop bar.

Register for a Prana Salt Cave gentle yoga class held in a restorative halotherapy cave. Flow into Savasana by the sea with a Be Unlimited Yoga session, held seasonally on Wrightsville Beach's Crystal Pier. Or let nature be your spa as you stroll through floral oases at New Hanover County Arboretum or stunning Airlie Gardens. WELCOME TO WILMINGTON

With its charming riverfront setting, Wilmington provides year-round adventure. A walkable river and historic district with easy access to shops, cafes and entertainment make Wilmington a must-see Southern destination, on par with Charleston and Savannah.

Whether you are strolling the scenic Riverwalk along the storied Cape Fear River, taking in the history of the 230-block National Register Historic District, enjoying the city's vibrant entertainment scene or tasting artfully presented dishes of fresh, local seafood, you'll learn quickly this is no ordinary coastal town. In fact, Condé Nast

Traveler named Wilmington one of the "Best Towns in the U.S."

Wilmington is the hub of arts, culture, shopping and dining, anchored by the two-mile Riverwalk. Timeless character, outdoor recreation, entertainment, water tours and alfresco dining options combine to earn Wilmington's Riverwalk a distinction as one of *USA Today*'s "Best Riverwalks."

CULTURE & HISTORY

Step back in time on a horse-drawn carriage ride, trolley or guided walking tour through Wilmington's charming National Register Historic District. Find famous TV and movie filming locations on a self-guided tour or paranormal activity

on the Ghost Walk. Explore the WWII-era Battleship NORTH CAROLINA, named one of the "Best Museum Ships." Examine life of another age at three historic house museums: Bellamy Mansion Museum of History & Design Arts, Burgwin-Wright House & Gardens and Latimer House Museum. Explore the region's history and science at the Cape Fear Museum of History and Science or immerse yourself in the visual arts at Cameron Art Museum. Climb aboard a century-old steam locomotive or see model trains at the Wilmington Railroad Museum.

ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT

Live Oak Bank Pavilion at Riverfront Park is one of the most scenic places to catch your next concert or show; the boutique outdoor amphitheater offers panoramic views of the Cape Fear River and attracts national acts. Or, enjoy a show at Greenfield Lake Amphitheater to hear popular acts in a waterfront setting. Explore your creative side at places like Thalian Hall Center for the Performing Arts, noted as one of the most beautiful and historic theaters in the country, or The Wilson Center, which offers a lineup that includes Broadway shows, concerts and contemporary dance series.

OUTDOORS & FAMILY FUN

Ample parks, recreation areas and access to three nearby beaches make Wilmington a paradise for outdoor lovers. Find adventure amidst the pristine beauty of New Hanover County Arboretum, Airlie Gardens and Greenfield Park to name just a few.

Splash down with your family at Jungle Rapids Family Fun Park, known for its seasonal water park and year-round arcade games, go-karts, mini golf, laser tag and more. Or bounce high at Defy Wilmington or Flip n Fly, Wilmington's two trampoline parks.

FOOD & DRINKS

Sample local and innovative restaurants serving farm-to-fork to catch-to-table coastal cuisine, Southern comfort food, international dishes and more. Wilmington's River District alone has more than 40 locally owned restaurants and pubs. Follow the Wilmington Ale Trail to craft breweries and bottle shops. FRESH-TO-TABLE

The area is a destination not only for diners but also for chefs and restauranteurs who are committed to serving locally sourced ingredients.

Pair creative craft cocktails with equally inventive dishes at manna ave. 123, the first and only restaurant in Wilmington to receive the prestigious AAA Four Diamond Award. Or sample standout dishes at PinPoint Restaurant, previously named one of "The South's Best Restaurants" by Southern Living. At Tarantelli's, indulge in authentic Italian dishes made from original family recipes. Or go for one of the signature

Lowcountry dishes by James Beard Award Best Chef Southeast Semi-Finalist Chef Keith Rhodes (CATCH).

Ingredients from local, sustainable farms are grilled over natural hardwood charcoal in casually refined indoor and outdoor settings at Port Land Grille. Savorez brings Latin flavors to downtown Wilmington. The fresh bounty of the NC Coast is highlighted in the authentic Italian dishes at Quanto Basta.

With river and sea holding such prominence here, you'll find freshcaught seafood around every corner. At James Beard Award Best Chef





Southeast Semi-Finalist Chef Dean Neff's Seabird in Wilmington, indulge in oysters, slow-smoked yellowfin tuna or the seasonal seafood tower. Order "first plates" salmon or tuna poke at Salt Fish Restaurant and Bar in Carolina Beach. Wrightsville Beach's EAST Oceanfront Dining at Blockade Runner Beach Resort uses locally harvested clams and fresh-caught fish complemented by fresh-grown vegetables and herbs from its own seaside garden.



DINERS & DIVES

Visitors can experience an array of famous flavors from restaurants showcased on Food Network's "Diners, Drive-Ins and Dives."

Start the day with a Southern-style breakfast or brunch at Wilmington establishments like Cast Iron Kitchen (known for its famous Dirty South Biscuit) and Sweet n Savory Café.

Taste around town like Guy Fieri as you sample the eclectic mix of appetizers and hearty sandwiches at downtown's The Copper Penny or satisfy your comfort food craving with the signature gourmet burgers and sides at Fork N Cork.

Calabash-style seafood is SOMETHING FISHy Seafood Restaurant's claim to fame in Wilmington or try the Latin American twist on classic seafood at Ceviches' near Wrightsville Beach.

Beach House Burgers in Kure Beach has a low-key exterior but serves up big flavor with burgers, fries and onion rings fresh to-go with a side of ocean views at this seasonal walk-up. And you'll want to join the line of patrons waiting to try the famous porkchops at Freddie's Restaurant.

Carolina Smokehouse in Carolina Beach fills your plate with fall-off-the-bone BBQ that you can enjoy with oceanfront views on the topside deck. Go hot with specialty burritos at Flaming Amy's Burrito Barn, voted "One of the 33 Best Burritos in America" by Thrillist, or try the Kick-flip quesadillas at Nollie's Taco Joint.


CHEERS TO BREWS & FOOD

Pub-style to inventive cuisines are on the menu at several area breweries, allowing you to wash it down with their brand of suds. Front Street Brewery, Wilmington's original restaurant and brewery, offers delish appetizers like their famous pulled chicken nachos, lunch and dinner. Or order a plate of schnitzel, spaetzle, sausages, even "Beyond Sausage" for vegetarians at the friendly German Prost Biergarten. Wrightsville Beach Brewery spreads the coastal vibe with local-caught oysters and signature items like kimchi and fried oyster bites or crab cake pizza.

Brew culture also finds independent coffee shops, roasters and tea houses ready to complement your caffeine cravings. Visit one of Drift Coffee & Kitchen's three locations for a Market Bowl Breakfast.







Or choose a muffin or bagel to go with a nitro cold brew Mermaid Magic at Kure Beach's Happy Hippies Java Hut.

KID-FRIENDLY EATS

Find bites all palates will enjoy in area eateries. Celebrity chef Vivian Howard's restaurant, Benny's Bigtime Pizzeria, is known for its open kitchen and woodburning pizza ovens. At CheeseSmith, order a classic American grilled cheese sandwich or branch out to artisanal sandwiches featuring a variety of cheese and toppings like house-made tomato jam.

Lazy Pirate Island Sports Grill in Carolina Beach creates innovative dishes with fresh seafood and the kids can still order chicken nuggets, pizza and mac n' cheese. Enjoy a casual family dinner on the second-story Admirals Deck at Shark Bar and Kitchen or take in scenic views of Banks Channel while enjoying a sunset meal at South Beach Grill in Wrightsville Beach.



TOURS, CRUISES & PARKS

TOURS & CRUISES - See famous film and TV locations on a self-guided tour or savor the flavors of the Wilmington Ale Trail. Embrace the cool breezes and fall colors on a sunset sailing cruise or get a thrill on a haunted pub crawl.

NATURE OUTINGS - Embark on an informative river cruise crafted to showcase natural coastal wonders and wildlife. swamp forests and other extraordinary habitats. Zeke's Island, on the North Carolina coast, can be reached solely by boat or kayak. Set out on a guided tour and paddle your way here or at Carolina Beach State Park to see the everchanging landscapes and awe-inspiring wildlife of these ecological treasures. Or, discover Masonboro Island Reserve: at 8.4 miles in length, it is the longest undisturbed barrier island in southern North Carolina. Only accessible by boat, kayak or canoe, it's an ideal habitat for birds, fish, invertebrates and sea turtles.

FORT FISHER STATE RECREATION AREA

- Enjoy six miles of protected shoreline spanning the ocean and river. Hike maritime forest trails past a WWII bunker to an observation deck with an uninhibited water view. Cruise along the beach with four-wheel drive, allowed with permit.

GREENFIELD PARK - Walk or bike the nearly five-mile trail that skirts the lake, then treat yourself to waterside concerts of national and regional artists at Greenfield Lake Amphitheater.

YOGA - Stretch your comfort zone in yoga classes set in picturesque settings such as oceanfront on the Crystal Pier, seaside in Kure Beach, riverfront on Battleship NORTH CAROLINA or in Airlie Gardens.



Groove to bluegrass jams at Satellite Bar, jazz it up in Cameron Art Museum's Café or enjoy local tunes seasonally at Bellamy Mansion Museum. Dance to live music year-round at Carolina Beach's SeaWitch Café and Tiki Bar. Discover Reggae Festivus at The Lazy Pirate Island Sports Grill on summer Sundays. The Palm Room in Wrightsville Beach is a favorite spot for specialty drinks and live music.

LOUNGES, BARS & SPEAKEASIES

Old-school vibes radiate from downtown Wilmington hotspots. Bourgie Nights is a gem known for live music and handcrafted cocktails. Wander down Smith Alley to Blind Elephant, a Prohibitionstyle speakeasy serving Moscow mules on-tap alongside craft cocktails and spirits. Whiskey lovers won't want to miss Whiskey Tango Foxtrot's premium concoctions, with weekend live music and dueling piano nights.

The best spots in town to sip cocktails and catch the sunset over the Cape Fear River are the rooftop bars Cloud 9 and aView Rooftop Bistro, or enjoy a frozen rosé on a barge at Anne Bonny's Bar and Grill.

CRAFT BREWERIES & DISTILLERIES

Named among "America's Beeriest Beach Towns," Wilmington's craft beer scene is thriving. Front Street Brewery, the area's first brewhouse, offers awardwinning craft brews and an impressive selection of bourbons, or enjoy one of the two outdoor beer gardens and 24 taps at Hi-Wire Brewing. At Edward Teach Brewing, order suds from a ship-shaped bar inside a historic firehouse.

Sours, Belgians and other noteworthy ales take center stage at Flytrap Brewing or pair easy-to-drink ales with yoga at



Waterline Brewing Co. Flying Machine Brewing creates everything from Berliner Weisse to a simple IPA at its Wilmington location or its taproom and kitchen in Wrightsville Beach.

Enjoy Good Hops Brewing's smallbatch brews alongside a dog-friendly beer garden and disc golf course in Carolina Beach. Wrightsville Beach Brewery leans into regional flavors with Oysterman Stout and a full menu, beer garden and yearround events.

Follow the self-guided Wilmington Ale Trail to more than 15 breweries and taste the handcrafted selections on tap; download an Ale Trail map at WilmingtonAndBeaches.com.

Discover a rich heritage of distilling at three distilleries creating small-batch spirits. End of Days' hand-distilled, cornbased vodka and gin, along with rum made with molasses and raw cane sugar, have won national awards. Tours are by reservation.

The copper still at Wilmington Distillery brings interesting spirits like IZZYz rum, Von Vodka, Honey Cornbread Moonshine and more to one of the oldest sections of the historic district.

Also, sample and purchase signature rums from Four Hounds Distilling in Carolina Beach knowing that 1 percent of your purchase goes to dog rescues.





Out & About

IN WILMINGTON'S NEIGHBORHOODS

Wilmington is home to vibrant neighborhoods each with its own character and distinct vibe. Find dynamic arts and culture, hip coffee shops, stores full of vintage wares and locally owned restaurants and bars tucked into our unique and historic neighborhoods.

DOWNTOWN/RIVER DISTRICT

A breathtaking view of the Cape Fear River and the WWII Battleship NORTH CAROLINA from the two-mile Riverwalk enhances your experience as you visit the markets, boutiques, restaurants and more in our downtown River District. Come for a taste adventure at restaurants that offer fresh local seafood to lively dishes from south of the border. Enjoy concerts by national acts at Live Oak Bank Pavilion, the scenic amphitheater at Riverfront Park, Browse the array of wares in historic commercial buildings at Chandler's Wharf and The Cotton Exchange or seek out the unusual at Black Cat Shoppe or Edge of Urge.

HISTORIC DISTRICT

Immerse in Wilmington's rich history on a guided, self-guided or horse-drawn carriage tour of downtown's 230+ block National Register Historic District. Explore Colonial life at the Burgwin-Wright House and Gardens, or visit Bellamy Mansion Museum, built on the eve of the Civil War. It boasts Greek Revival, Neoclassical and Italianate architectural elements. One of the finest examples of Victorian-era architecture is Latimer House, with tales of three Latimer generations.

BROOKLYN ARTS DISTRICT


Anchored by the circa 1817 Brooklyn Arts Center, this arts-filled neighborhood boasts live music, art galleries and breweries. Shop local artisan vendors at the BAC Holiday Flea and gallery crawls. Indulge in craft ales at Edward Teach Brewing or Flytrap Brewing, or visit Bottega Art & Wine, a wine bar and art gallery. Savor seafood and vegetable dishes at Three10, which is housed in a beautifully restored historic home, or grab soup and a sandwich from The Kitchen Sink.

SOUTH FRONT DISTRICT

Dine at celebrity chef Vivian Howard's restaurant, Benny's Big Time Pizzeria, feast on tasty tacos at BlockTaco, a hand-cut steak at True Blue, then catch a Sunday night bluegrass jam session at the dogfriendly Satellite Bar and Lounge. The visual creations at theArtWorks™ gallery are always inspiring. Wellness enthusiasts will want to visit Native Salt Cave and Wellness for some halotherapy or a yoga class. Enjoy a brew in New Anthem Brewery's spacious tap room or sip vino in the seasonally-driven wine-focused restaurant, The Second Glass.

CARGO DISTRICT

Possibly Wilmington's most unusual neighborhood, the Cargo District's variety of dining, boutiques and coffee shops, most housed in shipping containers, is an attraction in its own right. Kick back with





a local beer and friends at Alcove Beer Garden. Treat yourself to mouthwatering burgers and tots at Mess Hall, artisanal grilled cheese sandwiches at CheeseSmith or authentic street food at Beat Street. Discover local and fair trade finds at Hello, Love.

CASTLE STREET ARTS& ANTIQUE DISTRICT

Experience a treasure hunter's dream in this quaint corner of Wilmington. Revel in live music and vinyl records at Gravity Records, unearth unique finds at Michael Moore Antiques and indulge in the charm of vintage clothing at Jess James + Co. Kick back at the bar or enjoy the finest seasonally inspired, ingredient-driven Southern cuisine at Olivero, captained by James Beard nominee Sunny Gerhart.

Other don't-miss neighborhoods include the up-and-coming Soda Pop District, named for the former 1930s Coca-Cola bottling plant and now home to Cugino Forno and Folk's Café as well as Hi-Wire Brewing. Midtown offers family-friendly attractions Jungle Rapids Family Fun Park and historic Airlie Gardens and some of the area's best shopping at Mayfaire Town Center, Lumina Station, Independence Mall and The Ivy Cottage.



The Past's Presence

HISTORY SPANNING GENERATIONS ON LAND & SEA







From the 1500s - when mariners and pirates dubbed the treacherous offshore seascape "Cape of Feare" because it was spiked with shipwrecks - to today, the struggles, the triumphs and the adventures of our ancestors not only shaped coastal North Carolina but also American and world history. Many of Wilmington's most famous places and spaces are now museums or open for public tours throughout the 230+-block National Register Historic District.

1776-1782

THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

The Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge (February 1776) took place just 20 miles northwest of Wilmington and is known as the Lexington and Concord of the South, the victory that ended British authority in North Carolina.

 The Burgwin-Wright Museum House & Gardens (c. 1770) offers daily and special candlelight tours.

1840-1859

EARLY 19TH CENTURY

Wilmington became the largest city in North Carolina following the arrival of the Wilmington and Weldon Railroad in 1840. Some of the city's most impressive structures were built between 1850 and 1860, several of which allow public tours and special events.

- Tour the restored slave quarters and the main house at Bellamy Mansion Museum of History & Design Arts (c. 1861).
- Take a guided tour of the Latimer House Museum (c. 1852), a true gem from

HISTORY

Wilmington's pre-war housing boom.

 Book a guided tour of Thalian Hall (c. 1858) for a behind-the-scenes look at one of the oldest theaters in the country.

1861-1865

THE CIVIL WAR

Fort Fisher protected Wilmington until it fell to Union troops on Jan. 15, 1865 during the largest naval bombardment of the 19th Century. Cameron Art Museum (CAM) stands on the site of the Battle of Forks Road, a Civil War skirmish that was won by the 1,600 United States Colored Troops (USCT) who fought for the Union. Many of the African American soldiers who fought there were native to the area; after the war, many stayed to build the community.

- Explore the South's largest earthen fort, waterside walking trails and interpretive exhibits at Fort Fisher State Historic Site.
- See history re-enactors at the anniversary of the Battle of Fort Fisher every January.
- Visit the nation's first park honoring the USCT at CAM and see Boundless by Stephen Hayes, a bronze sculpture honoring the USCT with life-size casts of 11 African American men who are USCT descendants and reenactors.





1865-1898

RECONSTRUCTION & BEYOND

The newly freed Black population after Emancipation started new businesses, ran for office and took up professions in Wilmington. These freedoms were attacked by a violent white supremacy campaign that resulted in the Wilmington Coup of 1898. The insurrection culminated in electoral fraud, the burning of the city's Black newspaper offices and the deaths of an unknown number of African Americans.

- Cape Fear Museum of History & Science interprets the experiences of Wilmington African Americans and changes in the region.
- Wilmington Tours' African American History self-guided app tour stops at 32 significant sites, landmarks and neighborhoods.

1940-1970




MID-20TH CENTURY

The Wilmington shipyard built 243 ships in the 1940s. Preservation of WWII heritage saw Wilmington named the

first city in the U.S. as an "American World War II Heritage City."

The city is home to Battleship NORTH CAROLINA, one of the most decorated battleships of her time. Explore nine decks of the restored WWII-era battleship. The half-mile SECU Memorial Walkway around the Battleship honors each branch of the military. Or visit one of the only remaining USO buildings still standing,





housing a small WWII home-front heritage museum.

- Come for seasonal events aboard the Battleship NORTH CAROLINA.
- Book a special tour to explore rarely seen sections of the ship.

HISTORIC ARCHITECTURE

Homes and commercial buildings alike exude character in Wilmington, ranging from late 1700s through early 1900s styles as varied as Colonial Revival, Queen Anne, Italianate, Victorian and Craftsman.
