Asheboro, NC

Asheboro is home to the world's largest natural habitat zoo, the North Carolina Zoo, which features wild animals and plants from North America and Africa with Asia coming soon! Recognized for its natural habitats and world conservation programs, the zoo continues to grow and evolve into a top leader internationally.

The North Carolina Aviation Museum and Hall of Fame and American Classic Motorcycle Museum entice all ages with a depiction of transportation history. Enjoy monthly entertainment at Bicentennial Park in the heart of downtown Asheboro during their summer concert series. See a show at the historic Sunset Theatre located in downtown Asheboro or head out to the historic McCrary Ballpark and catch a wooden bat baseball game with the Asheboro ZooKeepers.

Petty Family Attractions


Randleman, NC

Summertime fun includes the annual NC Food Truck State Championship and monthly concerts at Commerce Square Park. Find outdoor adventures all year long with prime bass fishing along 100 miles of shoreline at Randleman Lake or enjoy a nature hike at Randleman's Deep River State Trail access point.











• Be sure to take in the beautiful views of Deep River all along the Randleman Deep River Nature Trail. Walk across the bridge on the downstream section to see where the trail from Worthville will join the existing section of the **Deep River** State Trail.


seagrove Pottery

Seagrove, NC

Take a drive down NC Highway 705, also known as Pottery Highway to explore over eighty working potters within a 30-mile radius. Visit shops and galleries that offer year-round events including a **Potters' Pumpkin Patch, Tea with Seagrove Potters,** and **Pottery**

Festival Weekend - held annually the weekend before Thanksgiving. Many of the crafters come from generations of potters in the area making various pieces using clay from the state. Not only is there pottery, but the area is also home to **Seagrove Orchids** and **Carolina Bronze Sculpture and Gardens.** Explore the small local shops selling homemade goods from artists across our great state, including **B3 Artisan Wares and Studio** and **Fiber & Fire Gallery.** Be sure to grab a drink or a snack at **The General Wine & Brew** or **Asheboro Popcorn Co**.









 One of the cool sections of the trail at Clay Presnell Memorial Park follows the Potters Grove Disc Golf Course into and through the woods. After your walk, visit and shop area potteries or visit the North Carolina Pottery Center and discover the beauty and the stories behind North Carolina's world-class clay culture.

Year-round thrills await at **Kersey Valley Attractions** with their **Ziplining**, **Bomb Bowling**, **Axe Throwing**, **Laser Tag**, and **Escape Rooms**. Enjoy seasonal offerings on this 83-acre adventure park with award-winning haunts at **Spookywoods**, **Maize**

Adventure, and Lights, Action, Santa! - Kersey Valley Christmas.

Family fun in Archdale is at **Creekside Park & Greenway** with access to three miles of walking trails, state-of-the-art playgrounds, dog park, tennis courts, an orienteering course, and an 18-hole disc golf course. Seasonal events you will not want to miss include outdoor concerts and movies on the lawn.

Golfers can check out **Holly Ridge Golf Links** for a challenging course with manicured fairways or take it indoors to **The Bunker**, an indoor simulated golf and sports experience while enjoying Holly Ridge's renovated bar & grill.

Linbrook Heritage Estate

Trinity, NC

Trinity is home to one of the largest privately-owned destinations in the Southeast, **Linbrook Heritage Estate**. Follow along the Neal family history by beginning at the original homestead **The Historic Hoover House**. Next, **The Neal Agricultural and Industrial Museum** features an ample collection of John Deere® Tractors on display while guided tours are offered of **Linbrook Hall**, the Estate's 36,000 sq ft home. The **Trinity Museum/Winslow House**, ca. 1855, is located in the center of

the City of Trinity. It is one of about ten antebellum era houses left in the Old Trinity College (now Duke University) area of Highway 62 in Trinity.



Millstone Creek Orchards

Create memories and form traditions at Ramseur's **Millstone Creek Orchards**, a family-owned u-pick farm experience providing seasonal tours, children's garden, and the Apple Barn Country Store selling fresh local produce and jarred items. Enjoy unique shopping experiences and charming small town street

festivals in Downtown Ramseur, frequently used for photography and feature films. Discover the remains of a dam and a historic cotton mill built in 1850 at nearby **Deep River State Trail** access points.

Combining history with recreation in Franklinville, the **Deep River State Trail** access points have riverside views perfect for seasonal walking, biking, and jogging. History buffs find **Faith Rock** of interest where in 1782, American Patriot Andrew Hunter escaped by mounting Tory Army leader Fanning's horse to ride down

> the steep 75-foot rock into the river, taking the ultimate "leap of faith".



The Liberty Showcase Theate

Liberty & Staley, NC

Liberty is buzzing with musical talent from bluegrass superstars and business owners, Dewey and Leslie Brown, of **The Liberty Showcase Theater.** This historic theater is a premier venue for rising stars and established national talent performances all year long.

Held twice a year, the **Liberty** Antiques Festival brings over 400 vendors to a 100-acre farm to sell antiques and collectibles to visitors from across the country. Staley's rural land



is where the oldest homestead in Randolph County is located. **The Thomas Marley House**, built in 1816, is listed on the National Registry of Historic Places.

Early Spring - March/April

Healthy Communities invites you to join their Sunday Hike Adventures on March 12 - Spring into Action - Hike from Mundo Vista at Camp Caraway to Slip Rock Mountain and April 16 - Celebrate Trails - Hike to the top of Mount Shepherd, the highest elevation in Randolph County.

- The City of Archdale will host a ribbon cutting event at the Creekside Greenway -Outer Loop. The City of Randleman will hold a ribbon cutting at the Worthville Blueway.
- The Town of Seagrove will host a trek through town along their downtown sidewalks.

- NC Hike to Russell Gold Mine in the Uwharrie National Forest.
