




This is your time to do exactly as you please.

Whether you long to join the folks at a festival or celebration or take a solo walk along quiet shores, your every wish is granted. Climb to lighthouse perches that reveal 360 degrees of island splendor, cast a line into the surf, or take a zipline tour through a swamp.

We share our home with some amazing friends.

Our barrier islands are surrounded by more than water. Look in any direction, up into the sky and down below the surface, and you'll find a world of habitats to be discovered. Tidal flats, creek-fed marshes, inlets, sand dunes, and maritime forests create healthy homes where sea creatures, plants, and wildlife thrive. They also create an endless source of amazement for visitors of every age and interest.

Residents and visitors engage in supporting safe nesting sites for Loggerhead Sea Turtles on our beaches. High tides deposit an amazing array of interesting shells, especially after storms churn the waters out at sea.

It seems that hirds find our islands to be the perfect rest stop on their travels along the coastal flyway. (Naturally, we named Bird Island in their honor.) Birdwatchers often rewarded with sightings of rare species, along with glimpses of our beautiful resident bird friends.

There's something mesmerizing about the swooping flight of a snowy egret over the marsh or the fishing skills of a great blue heron. Keep your eyes open. There are as many as 330 species to be found here.

Not far from the beaches. local nature preserves offer hiking trails through lowland forests. You may even spy a few carnivorous plants along the way. Take a guided ecotour deep into a swamp park through a maze of cypress knees that native reptile and amphibian creatures call home.

Take a hike. Take a boat. Take a kayak. But be sure to take time to explore the wonders around you.





Collect shells and memories.

As the tide recedes, you'll find that many of our beaches are laden with natural treasures brought in by the tide. Study up on the many kinds of shells here. You'll find them to be endlessly fascinating. They are Mother Nature's remarkable architecture for our sea creatures' homes.

You're welcome to gather shells as the ultimate beach vacation souvenir. But always remember that if you find a shell with a living creature inside, put it back on the beach or in the water so it can live peacefully and contribute to nature.

New treasures arrive daily here. So come again tomorrow or try another Brunswick Island to expand your collection.





CALICO SCALLOP

Argopecten gibbus

An eye-catching patchwork of red and pink gives this colorful bivalve its name. Often used to make jewelry, ornaments, and other accessories.



COMMON NUTMEG

Cancellaria reticulata

This small, textured shell with an interesting lattice pattern is also home to a sea snail. The shell is quite sturdy and often still whole once it washes to shore.



AUGER SHELL

Terebridae

The former home of a carnivorous snail, this high-spired shell is aptly named for its resemblance to a rock-drill bit.



LETTERED OLIVE

Americoliva sayana

This olive varies from gray to reddish-brown with zigzag markings and lives near shore or on sand flats near inlets.



KEYHOLE URCHIN

Mellita quinquiesperforata

Commonly known as the sand dollar, this urchin is disc-shaped and is identified by its five keyhole slots. Please do not take any living sand dollars from their habitat.



BABY'S EAR

Sinum perspectivum

Look for this roundish shell on your stroll down the beach. It's usually solid white with a shallow coil. Don't be fooled by its delicate look. This shell was once home to a carnivorous creature!



TRUE TULIP

Fasciolaria tulipa

This shell can be distinguished from a banded tulip by the 15 or more brown lines on the main body. Grows up to 9.5" in length.



LIGHTNING WHELK

Busycon contrarium

This ribbed whelk with its distinctive alternating bands was used by Native American tribes to fashion both tools and jewelry. Often found in both sand and muddy areas.



MOON SNAIL

Naticarius canrena

This beautiful shell can be identified by its semitransparency. Its former occupant is known to feed on other snail and clam species.

You know that sad look your dog gives you when you start packing your bags to leave? This time, give your pooch some news that's better than a biscuit. Tripswithpets.com named Caswell Beach and Oak Island numbers 1 and 2 on their list of "Top Dog-Friendly Beaches in North Carolina." So, pack a leash and toys in a bag all their own.

All six of our beautiful beaches welcome leashed dogs year-round (hours vary), and some offer off-leash freedom fall until spring. Your dog must be closely supervised in case they head for the water, and other guests will appreciate that they don't wander into their quiet space to check out their snacks.

You can find pet-friendly hotel and motel accommodations and a wide range of vacation rental homes that welcome pets. You'll also find boarding kennels throughout the area, some even provide beach outings for your dog or let you come by to take the dog out for walks. (Oh boy, oh boy!)

Many of our towns and communities feature dog parks for friendly play and sniffing, including Salty Dog Park in Oak Island and Shallotte Township Park in Shallotte. Lots of our restaurants and breweries are pet-friendly, so bring the dog to enjoy our outdoor and waterfront dining settings.


Few experiences are more serene and inspiring than a glide through the salt marshes and waterways of North Carolina's Brunswick Islands. Whether you choose to travel by kayak, paddleboard, or canoe, your perspective changes with this close-range view sitting just above the water's surface.

Explore an ecosystem of oyster beds, fish, crabs, and skates. In these guiet realms you can hear the call of birds, the rustle of marsh grass, and the splash of fish skipping through the water along with the occasional squeal of delight from friends and family who spy something new.

No need to haul equipment from home. Our expert outfitters have everything you need to explore our wetlands, including gear, training, and tips for the best routes. The entire county offers paddling experiences, including blackwater rivers and creeks as well as the Intracoastal Waterway. Keep your eyes open for otter, deer, egrets, great blue herons, and brown pelicans, as well as bottlenose dolphins on their own fishing expedition.

How about a guided tour?

Plan a half- or full-day tour with the experts to get the most out of your experience. Outfitters can arrange everything for you,



or paddleboard rentals and transport, along with expert guidance through marshland mazes and waterways. You may opt for a twilight tour to enjoy a magnificent sunset and stargazing from your kayak—truly a oneof-a-kind experience to write home about.

Rather walk than paddle?

Several of our towns provide boardwalks and scenic walkways along our rivers, marshes, and the Intracoastal Waterway. Bring your fishing gear or camera as you look for blue heron, eagle, spot, flounder, and alligator.

When you live in a place that includes the "Seafood Capital of the World," you know a thing or two about where to find and bring in the best catch. But we're also known for amazing sportfishing. Ask any local and they'll be happy to give a bit of advice.

What's your pleasure?

You can simply claim your spot on the beach, plant your rod holder in the sand, and spend a glorious day casting into the surf for red drum, blue fish, whiting, or flounder, depending how they're running. Cast a bait net and you're a self-sufficient fishing marvel.

Want to get a little farther out? The five fishing piers on our barrier islands stretch hundreds of feet out into the bountiful ocean. There's no limit to the conversation with locals and other visitors. Choose one and make a day of it. Fishing passes vary.

For exciting blue water adventure, our local charter captains can get you on the fish. You'll find larger charters with the speed for deep sea adventure 45 miles out in the Gulf Stream as well as custom skiffs for inshore fishing in the marsh creeks and inlets. These guides know the species and the weather conditions to make the most of your half- or whole-day trip while trolling, bottom fishing, or casting for big game fish.

If you have your own boat, you'll find plenty of public access ramps with parking throughout our towns, and private marinas offer slip rentals and fueling. For the ideal fishing vacation, tie up your boat on your private dock at a rental home with canal or marsh-side access.

Whether fishing is your passion or just an excuse to be on the water, we promise you'll reel in great memories day after day.









HOLDEN BEACH PIER

Purchased by the Town of Holden Beach, plans are underway to upgrade the pier and other onsite public facilities such as concessions and beach access.

OAK ISLAND PIER

Rebuilt in 2019, the pier is complete with a pier house, a bait and tackle store, restaurant, and coffee shop.

OCEAN CREST PIER

Also located on Oak Island, the pier has a full line tackle shop and onsite weather station. A restaurant adjoins the pier.

OCEAN ISLE BEACH PIER

An Ocean Isle family favorite, the pier has bait and tackle as well as an arcade, grill room, and ice cream shop.

SUNSET BEACH PIER

A 900-foot stretch into the ocean, the pier has a snack bar and tackle shop and is fully handicap accessible with free scooter chairs.


Whether you indulge at one of dozens of waterfront bistros or bring your market catch back to your beach house to feed your flock, nobody leaves the table hungry.

Whether you arrive at your favorite restaurant by boat, on foot, or in an SUV filled with family, you're about to experience one of the Brunswick Islands' most coveted vacation traditions—big helpings of freshly prepared food, served with warm and gracious hospitality from hush puppy starters to decadent desserts.

Yes, we have a famous little town heralded as "The Seafood Capital of the World," but there's no limit to the cuisine offerings throughout the area—Asian, Mexican, Italian, barbecue, burgers—oh, who are we kidding? We're here for the seafood! It's best served with a frosty cold drink while overlooking the Atlantic, the Intracoastal, the Cape Fear River, or beneath oak trees beside green fairways. Some of our restaurants even start their seafood preparation before dawn when they send out their own boats to pull in the freshest catch.

And then there's world-famous Calabash style seafood—seafood prepared in the style that originated in the 1930's along the docks of its namesake town. What makes it so special that it's now imitated all over the world?

We take fresh shrimp, fish, oysters, clams, and crabs, fuss over them with a feather-light batter, drop them into a sizzling fryer for a hot second, and, voila, you have a puffy, flaky taste of fresh and salty heaven. Calabash style isn't Calabash unless it's served in mega portions. And for purists, Calabash seafood isn't Calabash unless it comes from its Brunswick Islands home. There's no substitute for authenticity.

Mornings at the beach should come with fresh-brewed coffee, tea, or other eyeopeners. Our coffee shops are amazing and range from those that boast fancy barista wizards to coffee/surf shops that send you out with a good cup of joe and a few surf tips. For something liquid a little later in the day, you'll find a winery, breweries, taprooms, and wine bars.

Don't miss the North Carolina Oyster Festival each October or any of the other festival celebrations throughout the year. There are always new tastes to try and old favorites to enjoy while you listen to music, explore arts and crafts, or try a carnival game.

Come see why we're called "North Carolina's Golf Coast."



You'll find 120 miles of sweeping emerald fairways including classic St. Andrews-style links courses, along with genteel but deceptively tricky Southern classic courses.

Not to brag, but we're masters at hosting golf buddy outings, family and couples play, or a child's first taste of the game—in a low-key setting that many prefer to the Grand Strand down the road. No matter your skill level, there's no better way to hone your skills than in a place where the love of the game is celebrated with every round.










Bald Head Island

Oak Island







The best of both worlds awaits, and we think vou deserve the best—times two.















Brunswick Town in Winnabow is site of the county's original settlement. Today, you can walk the grounds to find archaeological ruins of colonial homes and the shell of St. Philips Church among the ancient trees. Destroyed by the British during the Revolutionary War, Confederate earthworks were built on top of the site in 1862, abandoned in 1865, and the untouched Fort Anderson site still stands as one of the most pristine intact coastal fortifications in the nation.

Varnamtown offers an interesting waterfront on the Lockwood Folly River, where you can watch fishermen in action. The Boiling Spring Lakes and Green Swamp Nature Preserves will reveal rare birds and plants, including the carnivorous Venus Flytrap.

Offering a distinctively different vibe than our beaches, you'll find the mainland is a great way to mix it up on your Brunswick Islands vacation discovering wonders old and new.
