You may also want to take advantage of the many opportunities for outdoor fun, including kayaking, fishing and other water sports, hiking and golf.


We invite you to visit us in northeast North Carolina. You may fall in love with our town and decide to stay, as folks have done since the 17th century.

History lives here in Edenton and Chowan County.



THE EDENTON TEA PARTY


was the earliest organized women's political action in American history. On October 25, 1774, fifty-one women in Edenton formed an alliance wholeheartedly supporting the American cause against "taxation without representation." Edenton native, escaped slave, abolitionist, and writer hid here for seven years as a fugitive. Her memoir—Incidents in the Life of a Slave Girl—was one of the first narratives about the struggle for freedom by a female slave.

1 THE PENELOPE BARKER HOUSE WELCOME CENTER

A waterfront historic house offering local information, maps, trolley tours of historic sites, exhibits, restrooms, book/gift shop. Known as 'Edenton's Living Room', it is a nice place to relax and enjoy views of Edenton Bay. 10a-5p daily

2 1767 CHOWAN COURTHOUSE

The restored structure is now open for touring and community events. Under state law, the North Carolina Supreme Court can meet in only two other cities outside of Raleigh - Edenton and Morganton. The Courthouse Green runs from the Courthouse to the Revolutionary War cannon fronting Edenton Bay, and is lined with historic private homes. 4 CHOWAN COUNTY COURTHOUSE

The Office of the Register of Deeds has genealogy records and a complete cemetery survey of more than 5,000 grave sites from the early 1700s to the present.

5 CHOWAN COUNTY JAIL

One of the oldest jail in North Carolina, opened in 1825, is newly open to visitors. The jail housed criminals and served as a debtors prison. At the time it closed in 1980, it was the oldest jail in continuous operation in the US. The jail, located behind the 1767 Chowan Courthouse and the Jailors House, can be visited by contacting the Penelope Barker House Welcome Center.

6 CUPOLA HOUSE

Built in 1758 for Francis Corbin, an agent for Lord Granville, one of the eight Lords Proprietors of the Province (colony) of Carolina. Enjoy the Cupola House gardens, restored from plans dated 1769. The house may be seen as part of Historic Edenton State Historic Site walking tours Tues-Sat, 1pm and Sun, 12-3pm, April-October

7 EDENTON COTTON MILL VILLAGE & MUSEUM OF HISTORY

Donated to Preservation North Carolina in 1995, this intact mill complex has been preserved and is now a thriving residential neighborhood. Stroll the streets of historic cottages and the boardwalk located behind the mill, and explore the Edenton Cotton Mill Museum of History, open Sat-Sun, 10am-2pm.

COLONIAL WATERFRONT PARK

8 1886 ROANOKE RIVER LIGHTHOUSE



The lighthouse was originally located on screw-pilings in the Albemarle Sound marking the entrance to the Roanoke River near Plymouth. The lighthouse is believed to be the last extant example in the United States of a square frame building built for a screw-pile base. The lighthouse was in commission from 1887 until 1941. Tues-Sat, 10am-4pm.

9 EDENTON HARBOR

Offers protected dockage with nine transient boat slips, rest rooms with showers, a playground, picnic tables and grills, as well as kayak and paddleboard rentals and launch.

13 HISTORIC HICKS FIELD

Hicks Field was built as a WPA project in 1939. Its wooden grandstand is the only one remaining in North Carolina. During the summer season, Hicks Field is home to the Edenton Steamers, a summer collegiate baseball team.

14 IREDELL HOUSE HOMESITE

1800/1827 home of James Iredell, Associate Justice on the first US Supreme Court, and NC Superior Court Judge and Attorney General during the American Revolution. Birthplace of James Iredell, Jr., Governor of North Carolina, 1827–1828. The house may be seen as part of the historic building tours.

15 ST. PAUL'S FPISCOPAL CHURCH

The second-oldest surviving church building in North Carolina, 1736-1760. This still-active parish, organized under the first Vestry Act of 1701, holds the oldest charter in the state. Three colonial governors are buried in the historic churchyard cemetery.




